### Principal's Message

We love that students feel safe and feel a sense of belonging at Mountain View. We have many students who come before school and stay after school. We do have some students coming extremely early. We do not have supervision for students before 7:30 a.m. except in the cafeteria. Students may enter the cafeteria from the outside doors after 7:15 a.m. Students may wait for the bell in the rotunda or play outside on the playground after 7:30, when there will be supervision.

We do have an after school program for students, as well as the Learning Lab in the Community Learning Center. Students may register for the after school program which lasts until 5:30 p.m. Students in the after school program may eat dinner in the cafeteria, and they must be picked up by 6:00 p.m. The Learning Lab is a drop-in program. Students are not required to stay for the entire program and are not required to attend daily. Students can come when they have homework or need some extra help. Students must have a signed registration form before attending the program. The program starts with a snack. After the snack, students are doing homework and reading until 4:15. From 4:15 to 5:30 students finish homework as well as participate in learning activities and have open computer time.

If students are not involved in these specific activities, they need to go home or have other arrangements outside of the school campus.
